Directors Note

I'm really excited to be directing **Revealed**, a piece of work that is close to my heart. It was originally developed by The Red Earth Collective and Rites of Passage Productions, with a sharing in 2019 at Midlands Arts Centre in Birmingham, before going on to have a life in Bristol at the Tobacco Factory Theatres in 2022.

Daniel is one of the most generous writers and actors I know, so it's exciting to collaborate again to bring his words to life. We are both excited about the impact this body of work can have with audiences, and the things people may be inspired and activated to do as a result of engaging with the work. The first time I engaged with Revealed it inspired me to track down and connect with my biological dad who I'd never met!

As a director I'm fascinated by psychology and why people do the things they do, and really unpicking and delving deep into those layers, it really drives my creative practice and approach to storytelling. I've really enjoyed being in the rehearsal room with Daniel, Everal and Jayden, crafting something that speaks to people and hopefully really resonates with Coventry audiences.

Our measure of success for **Revealed** is if just one audience member can leave and feel activated, if just one person leaves the space and feels compelled to reconnect, speak to themselves or their loved ones to say, "I love you" then in my opinion that's a win. Life is short, we're only on this planet for a limited amount of time and I really hope the play encourages people to connect with their families, connect with people that are close to them and say some of things that they've always wanted to say but have never been able to.

Writers Note

Sometimes, locking yourself away in a room, creating far removed worlds and universes, and then placing flawed and goal-driven characters in them is exhilarating. I mean, come on! Who doesn't enjoy a high-concept Hollywood blockbuster every now and then?

However, there's nothing like observing your surroundings and deeply reflecting on pain. Lived experiences, fears, trauma, injustice, faith, mental health, family and need. To then develop a narrative grounded in reality and a deep desire to portray humanity's diversity, truthfully.

The latter is what **Revealed** is...

Seven years ago, Sandra Griffiths, the Director of The Red Earth Collective asked me a question that stopped me in my tracks.

"What do Black Men think and feel, but don't say?"

Then began my study and analysis of the unsaid, as a means to uncover and dissect the hidden languages and algorithms of the unspoken... A vehicle to create platforms that make room for; Change, inspiration, challenge, courage and most importantly love.

Seven years later... Here we all are!

I'm just a Black man from Birmingham with a creative edge. Who, like you, has been through ups, downs, highs and lows. But in all the years I've spent navigating this complex world, from a Black British outlook, I've had to really consider the true meaning of 'Love'.

Revealed is my exploration of that word, from a Male perspective. The love of self and the love of others.

Welcome to my edgy and abstract perspective. A viewpoint that will hopefully provide you with a unique and profound insight into three generations of anger, grief, survival, and hope for a better future. I hope this story calls you to action and shines a truthful light on not only what 'Black Men' think and feel, but humans - whilst exposing the consequences of neglect and the POWER of 'Love' as a decision.

The Red Earth Collective and Rites of Passage Productions

The Belgrade Theatre is working with The Red Earth Collective and Rites of Passage Productions to deliver a programme of public, community and education workshops and events that explore the mental health and wellbeing of Black Men.

The Red Earth Collective

The Red Earth Collective are a Black-led, Birmingham based organisation. They work with professional and emerging artists and people with lived experience of mental health to use the arts to challenge mental health stigma and discrimination experienced by global majority communities.

In 2019 they collaborated with Rites of Passage Productions to produce the first performances of **Revealed** which took place at the Midlands Arts Centre in Birmingham. In 2022 they continued that collaboration and delivered a programme of community workshops and Q&A sessions, with the cast and mental health professionals, when **Revealed** had a three-week run in the Tobacco Factory in Bristol.

As part of the **Revealed** programme Red Earth will work with community organisations in Coventry to deliver six creative workshops, aimed at people with lived experience of mental-health problems, inspired by themes and issues explored in the play.

During Revealed's run, Red Earth founder Sandra Griffiths will also host an after-show discussion with cast members and local mental health experts that further explore themes of Black masculinity, identity and wellbeing

Red Earth will also work in partnership with Talking Therapist Rotimi Akinsete on 'Black Men on the Couch' with two events taking place at The Belgrade in October and January.

Black Men on the Couch features high profile Black men who are interviewed by a Black male counsellor in front of an audience. The concept was created by Rotimi to combat mental health stigma and to encourage Black men to openly discuss their mental and emotional

health and to consider counselling and therapy as a form of support. Men who have previously featured on the couch include Benjamin Zephaniah, Ashley Walters, David Lammy and Stan Collymore.

Academic, Activist and TV personality Dr Kehinde Andrews and Daniel Carver Anderson who wrote and stars in Revealed will both be 'on the couch' in October.

To accompany the production, the Belgrade Theatre has commissioned artist Ayesha Jones to document family stories, focusing on communities within Coventry and the local area. This engagement work has led to a photographic art exhibition which will be displayed in the theatre's gallery and foyer spaces across the run.

Ayesha Jones Photography Artist

Ayesha Jones (b. 1990) is an artist based in Coventry. She works predominantly with photography and film and is interested in art as a catalyst for growth, healing and social impact.

For **Revealed** Ayesha has visited seven community groups and photographed over 100 individuals and families across Coventry and recorded oral family stories. A selection of which can be viewed and listened to in Belgrade Theatre's gallery and foyers. Ayesha has also photographed local community historian Maureen Cottle and her family. A selection of Maureen's archive on the Windrush generation in Coventry is also on display with the images Ayesha has taken of Maureen and her family.

Jones' work has been exhibited nationally and internationally and she has won awards, including Magnum Photos and The Photography Show's 30 under 30 international award and British Journal of photography's: Portrait of Britain and Decade of Change awards.
